United States Census 2010

Occurs every 10 Years.

The census determines the distribution of \$300 billion annually.

Determines Congressional representation.
Should take approximately 10 minutes to complete.

The information remains confidential for 72 years.

2010 Census Timeline: Key Dates

- Spring 2009: Census employees go door-to-door to update address list nationwide.
- Fall 2009: Recruitment begins for census takers needed for peak workload in 2010.
- February March 2010: Census questionnaires are mailed or delivered to households.
- April 1, 2010: Census Day
- April July 2010: Census takers visit households that did not return a questionnaire by mail.
- December 2010: By law, Census Bureau delivers population counts to President for apportionment.
- March 2011: By law, Census Bureau completes delivery of redistricting data to states.
