Trap, Neuter, Return


Trap-Neuter-Return, commonly referred to as "TNR," is humane and is the most effective method for controlling feral cat population growth. TNR benefits the cats and the community. Using this technique, community cats living outside are trapped, neutered, ear tipped (the universal symbol of a sterilized cat), and then returned to their outdoor home.

Steps to participate in the pilot program:

- Resident executes Community Cat agreement
- 2. County issues voucher to Resident
- 3. If applicable, County provides trap (for a refundable deposit).
- 4. Resident sets and monitors trap.
- 5. When cat is trapped, Resident follows instructions on voucher.
- Resident returns trap. County
 Confirms cat has been picked up from clinic and then returns deposit for trap.
