Program Series Overview

The Junior Naturalist Program Series is a series of half day Saturday programs covering a wide variety of topics within our natural world. The topics covered correspond with the science curriculums for grade 3-6. Youth will learn about and gain experiences in topics ranging from birds and insects to weather.

5 of the 10 program series will be offered each year. 2 programs will be offered every fall and every spring and 1 program will be offered each winter. Complete 5 of the 10 offered Junior Programs, within a 2 year time period and earn the status of Junior Naturalist. Receive a t-shirt and naturalist tool upon earning status!

Who: Youth ages 8-13

Cost: \$10.00 per program

What: Each youth will receive a morning snack and materials for each program. During the 1st program that the youth attends they will be given a Junior Naturalist notebook to help keep track of all program series information

Youth should dress in sturdy shoes for each program they are attending as that hiking will be a small part of most programs.

Programs offered:

Junior Stream Ecologist:

Stream ecologists study the interactions of living things

with the stream environment. During the program students will learn about water chemistry, stream habitats, and organisms that live in freshwater streams.

Junior Dendrologist: Dendrology is the study of trees. During this program students will learn how to identify trees and other woody vegetation characteristic of the upstate region. They will also be introduced to forestry common forestry practices.

Junior Geologist: Geology is the study of the origin, history, and structure of the earth. This is done through observation of landforms and rocks and minerals. In this program students will study the geologic composition of the upstate region, which is known for its granitic domes and exposed rock faces. Students will be introduced to geological processes and to skills used by geologists in the field.

Junior Wildlife Biologist: Wildlife Biology is an applied science. It is a study of wildlife and the surrounding environment. This program will introduce youth to some of the many skills needed in the field of wildlife biology. Students will identify tracks and scat of wildlife common to the upstate region.

Junior Herpetologist: Herpetology is the study of reptiles and amphibians. This program will cover amphibian and reptile species that are present in the upstate region. Students will be able to identify common species of reptiles and amphibians in the upstate region at the completion of the program.

Year II programs will include conservation, paleontology, botany, entomology and fisheries.
