CULTURAL COMMISSION

MISSION

The mission of the Museum of Art and History (a public, non-profit educational institution) is to collect, preserve and exhibit artifacts from the area and to teach the cultural history, natural history, and the arts of the county and surrounding areas. The Museum provides cultural enrichment, intellectual stimulation and learning as well as enjoyment to the county's citizens and visitors; also, to render assistance, whenever possible, to other museums and cultural institutions.

The mission of the Hagood Mill Historic Site is to reflect the multiple generations of indigenous, pioneer and rural life around the mill and in the county.

GOALS

- Execute project to stabilize the 105 year old 'Gaol' building that is on the National Register of Historic Places. To arrest the current deterioration and crumbling of the old building, this stabilization will include archival mortar re-pointing, repair to building façade, parapets and other architectural details, stabilization and repair on flat concrete section of roof. The use of the yet to be utilized SCAC Facilities Grant the museum was awarded during FY 2008 will compensate more than 50% of the project.
- Continue growth of Museum School offerings for children, adults and established artisans
- Complete and open the South Carolina Rock Interpretive Center at Hagood Mill Site

PRIOR YEAR ACCOMPLISHMENTS (Calendar Year 2007)

- The museum was awarded grants including a \$50,000 Facilities Grant and a second round of Three-Year Operational Support Grants from the South Carolina Arts Commission; two grants toward the realization of the South Carolina Rock Interpretive Center at Hagood Mill from both the state and regional divisions of the South Carolina National Heritage Corridor; a sponsorship grant from Wachovia Bank to support Youth Arts 2007.
- Museum Exhibition highlights for the year include 28th Annual Juried SC Artists Competition & Exhibition, Youth Arts 2008, "Trends in Photography"—a survey of regional photographers, "Charles Councell: 1896-1985"—a retrospective exhibition reflecting the life and travels of the well known Clemson artist, "Rock Paper Scissors"—group exhibition featuring works in stone and paper, "Michel Bayne: Southern Folk Pottery", Jeanet Dreskin: The Vastitude Paintings" and "Deborah Pagano: Narrative Collage & Assemblage".
- Educational programs included "Blacksmithing Then and Now", "Basketry Around the World", "An Evening of Chamber Music" with students from the South Carolina Governor's School for the Arts and Humanities. An array of readings and book signings with Sherry Austin, author of "Where the Woodbine Twines" and "Mariah of the Spirits", Jerry Alexander, author of "Where have all the Moonshiners Gone", well known children's book author, Kate Salley Palmer, and Dot Jackson, reading from while backed by song & music featured in her book, "Refuge". Two of our most popular workshops included "Basket Weaving with Pati English" and "An Introduction to Macro-Photography with Clay Bolt".
- The Hagood Mill continued daily business hours and also launched the third season of Music in the Mountains, including events such as "Ringing in the New Year with Old Time Music", "A Spring String Thing", "Forever Young" with 'Canjoe John', our annual "Old Time Fiddlin' Convention", "Music in the Mountains Square Dance" at Table Rock State Park, "Sixth Annual Hagood Mill Storytelling Festival" followed by one of our most popular events, "Selugadu: A Native American Celebration" and ending with "A Celtic Christmas at the Mill".

Also, the staff and volunteers at the Hagood Mill Site were delighted to have achieved the restoration
of the 19th Century D. Pratt Cotton Ginning Operation. This multi-year project required significant
volunteer man-hours and more than a few instances of hand made engineering due to the nonexistence of replacement parts. The gin operated for the first time in November marking the first
cotton ginned in Pickens County since the 1960s.

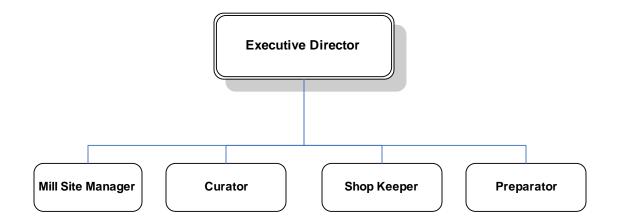
